# LOUISA MASON, ERIKA PALAFOX, ANNETTE ALAGGIA, MIMI ALIPERTI, PAT MCGRATH, SALLY VESCATEL



#### **LOUISA MASON**

Please note it was always my intention to "spotlight" Louisa as a member of the WCD; sadly, it never came to be. The following serves as that Spotlight and her Memoriam.

Sharon Lee writes about her friend: Louisa Mason:

While Covid 19 presented many justifiable excuses to languish, it was the pandemic's very social isolation mandates that sparked an idea in the mind of our fellow **WCD** member Louisa Mason to combat our sedentary inclinations. This lady, who was always the picture of fashion flair and physical energy, saw the restrictions as an opportunity to unite and uplift the **WCD** membership as well as her other friends by offering free one-and-one half hour yoga and tai chi classes via Zoom. These exercises had helped Louisa overcome cancer some years back, and she sought to spread the good news of their benefits. A retired teacher of Spanish, Italian and French, Louisa led the

group of mostly ladies through a non-stop regimen of stretching, calisthenics, and body tapping, explaining the benefits of the movements while cheering and joking along the way. She told everyone to keep plugging away at the exercises and offered assurances that, with consistent work, they would see improvements in flexibility, strength, and endurance.

At the end of every class, Louisa would call upon her students to open their hearts and minds to the universe and say a prayer for the ills of the world and for specific people who were sick or otherwise struggling. She would conclude every class with a group cheer: "Healthy body, happy heart, power brain. Yes! Yes! Yes!" It was during one of these classes that her students noticed something was not right with Louisa; that she was repeating exercises and having speech difficulties. Her husband, Greg, rushed her to the emergency room mid-lesson - Glioblastoma was the sad diagnosis. Louisa's doctors told her this type of brain cancer was "the bad one", but ever the optimist, she fought it for two years until her passing on August 8th, 2024. Besides the yoga and tai chi classes, Louisa was an active volunteer in other organizations. She was the mother of one son, Colin, who tragically predeceased her. She had a special love for children, teaching religion to the young people of St. Anastasia's Church and Italian to the Tyrolean Club in Ridgewood. Anyone who ever had lunch or attended an event with her would not be surprised that Louisa was also instrumental in hosting the Club's annual Christmas parties. She found joy in traveling and in social gatherings with abundant food and laughter.

One of Louisa's last parties was **WCD's** 2023 luncheon, where she bet on the horses and won big, cashing in at the prize booths staffed by her **WCD** friends. After almost every race, Louisa, a little mystified by her good fortune that day, declared, "I'm lucky!" We at **WCD** can certainly say the same when we recall the moments we shared with this exuberant and generous friend.




**MIMI ALIPERTI**
